REFUSE SERVICE

Customer Service at its Finest!

We're proud to provide you with the best service possible. Use these helpful guidelines to keep our neighborhoods safe and clean.

Curbside Service

You are entitled to curbside pick-up of your household refuse. Place your refuse containers between the sidewalk and curb in front of your residence no earlier than the evening before and no later than 6:30 a.m. on your collection day.

Know Your Collection Day

The City will collect your refuse on the same day each week. If you do not know what your collection day is, please call **311** or go to **www.cityofrochester**. **gov/residentialrefuse**.

Your Rolling Refuse Container

The rolling refuse container makes it easy to bring your throw-away items to the curb. If your container is full, you may use plastic bags or other containers. On collection day, please place your container three feet from any obstructions or additional containers. Observe weight restrictions of 200 lbs per rolling refuse container, 60 lbs per container and 30 lbs per bag. Remove your refuse containers from the curb within 24 hours after your collection day and store your container on the side or backyard of your premises.

Bulk Refuse

Have large items? We'll take them. Bulk refuse items are picked up **only on your regular refuse collection day.** Remove doors from refrigerators and other appliances. Loose wood, trees, brush and hedges must be tied in bundles that are no larger than four feet long and 18 inches in diameter. The bundles must weigh no more than 60 lbs. Nails in wood must be removed or pounded down.

Do not obstruct sidewalks or streets with refuse or debris.

On-Demand Service

On-Demand Service is available for a fee if you have a large amount of debris that needs to be picked up before your next scheduled refuse day, for example, when a tenant moves out, or for home and yard cleanups or small home improvement projects by owner.

For volumes of four cubic yards or more, a minimum fee of \$80 will be charged. Roll-off containers are available for rent for volumes greater than 10 cubic yards.

Illegal Dumping

Illegal dumping is a serious offense that is harmful to our community. Refuse placed in front of a residence must be generated by that residence. It is illegal to place refuse on public property or in a right-of-way.

Do not place household trash in a public litter receptacle. If you see illegal dumping taking place, please report it. Get a license plate number and a description of the vehicle and operator and call **311**, or call **(585) 428-5990** outside of the city.

RECYCLING - EVERY OTHER WEEK, BRING IT TO THE STREET!

Everyone should be recycling but not nearly enough people are doing it. Recycling is the law in Monroe County. Recyclables are collected every other week on your designated refuse pickup day. Please remove your recycling containers from the curb within 24 hours of your collection day and store your container on your premises.

It's Easy

Remember, if it tears, it's recyclable!

You can also recycle your drink cartons, juice boxes, cans, glass bottles, glass jars and plastic bottles, jars, jugs and tubs, **excluding Styrofoam and single use cups**. Simply rinse out your recyclable containers (you don't need to remove labels) and place them in your recycle container. Bring plastic shopping bags back to the grocery store rather than placing them in your recycle container.

Make it a Habit

The rewards of recycling are great: you preserve the environment and reduce demand on our natural resources. Make it a habit to separate your recyclables from the trash.

The City will collect your recyclables once every other week on the same day as your regular collection. If you do not know what your collection day is, please call **311** or go to **www.cityofrochester.gov/residentialrecycling**





HOLIDAY COLLECTION SCHEDULE

There will be no refuse or recycling collection on the holidays listed below. On these days, collection will be delayed one day for the remainder of the week following the holiday (e.g., routes with a Monday holiday will be picked up on Tuesday, Tuesday's collection will be picked up on Wednesday, etc.)

The following items may no longer be disposed of at the curb, and must be taken to ecopark for disposal: Any television, computer, monitor, printer, keyboard, mouse, VCR/ DVR/ DVD/ CD player, cell phone, video game console, and cables, cords or wires for an electronic device.



The **ecopark** provides Monroe County residents (no businesses, not-for-profits, home offices, etc.) with a "one-stop drop-off" site to dispose of or recycle certain items. The park is open Wednesdays, 1–6:30 pm and Saturdays, 7:30 am-1 pm (closed on holidays, Thanksgiving and Christmas weekends.)

Residents may recycle the following items for free and without an appointment:

- Automotive fluids (except motor oil)
- Pesticides & fertilizers
- Fuel (gas, diesel, kerosene, home heating oil)
- Flammable products (thinners, strippers, solvents, glues)
- Household cleaners
- Driveway sealer
- Pool & photo chemicals
- Cooking oil / cooking grease

Items that Require a Fee:

- Refrigerantcontaining appliances (refrigerators/freezers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers) \$15 each
- CRT picture tube TVs & monitors \$15 each
- Broken tube TVs & monitors \$25 each
- Flat screen TVs & monitors \$5 each
- Passenger vehicle tires \$5-10 for rimless tires \$12-18 for tires on rims

NOT ACCEPTABLE at ecopark:

- 55 gallon drums
- Asbestos & asbestos shingles
- Cans of dried paint (place in trash)
- Everyday alkaline batteries (place in trash)
- Glazing, spackle & joint compounds (place in trash)
- Products intended for industrial use
- Smoke & carbon monoxide detectors (place in trash or contact manufacturer)
- Used motor oil & vehicle batteries (contact auto retailer or repair shop)
